

# Downes-O'Neill J-Trader Installation

*Man Financial Edition*

## Step 1

Checking and installing correct version of Java. J-Trader requires that you have a specific version of Java installed on your trading computer. Check your Java version to see if it matches: 1.4\_2\_03. If not, you will need to install Java from this link: [http://mtradeproof.manfinancial.com/j2re-1\\_4\\_2\\_03-windows-i586-p.exe](http://mtradeproof.manfinancial.com/j2re-1_4_2_03-windows-i586-p.exe)

## Step 2

Installing J-Trader. Under primary user (not administrator), go to <http://www.downesoneill.com/online> and click on the Downes-O'Neill J-Trader login button. Prior to clicking on the "Client Login" button, complete the following steps:

- 1) Open up your Internet Options
- 2) Click on the Security Tab
- 3) Click on Trusted Sites
- 4) Click on Sites...
- 5) Uncheck "Require server verification (https:) for all sites in this zone"
- 6) Add the following website  
\*.manfinancial.com
- 7) Click Ok
- 8) Click Ok

Now click on "Client Login". A small pop up window will appear in the upper right hand corner. If it does not, make sure to allow your pop-up blocker software to allow all pop-ups from \*.manfinancial.com.

## Step 3

The first time you log into J-Trader may take up to 5-10 minutes. First, the program will check the version of Java to ensure that you have the correct one. If it doesn't find Java, it will attempt to install the correct version. Next, it will prompt you to accept the location to install a few configuration files. Click "Accept" and allow it to install the files. Once this is completed, you should see the small pop-up window convert into a login screen with the Downes-O'Neill logo along with boxes to enter in a username and password. Login with your personal username and password and you're ready to go!

## Other installation steps

If your computer is locked down pretty tight and need your IT administrator to set up the installation, we have seen that permissions need to be allowed for the following:

C:\Windows  
C:\Program Files  
C:\windows\win.ini

If the windows directory doesn't have a win.ini file, you need to create a blank one for it to attempt to read.
